Evans received a Masters of Architecture from Harvard University Graduate School of Design, and a Bachelor of Science in Architecture from the University of Virginia School of Architecture.

His social action work has supported a variety of causes. While at Harvard University Graduate School of Design (GSD), Evans was the founder and principal instructor for PROJECT LINK, a program that exposes Boston area youth to the possibilities of a design education. He was the acting chair for the GSD's Social Change and Activism organization, where he was responsible for leading the student group's various initiatives including educational outreach, symposiums, and design-build ventures. He was also awarded a Community Service Fellowship from the GSD to help the Beverly School for the Deaf plan for a new facility and translate issues of deaf culture, identity and education architecturally.

Evans was awarded the Alpha Rho Chi Medal by the faculty of the Harvard University Graduate School of Design for leadership, willing service for the school, and promise of professional merit through attitude and personality. He is also the recipient of several leadership and design work awards by Harvard University Graduate School of Design and the University of Virginia School of Architecture.
