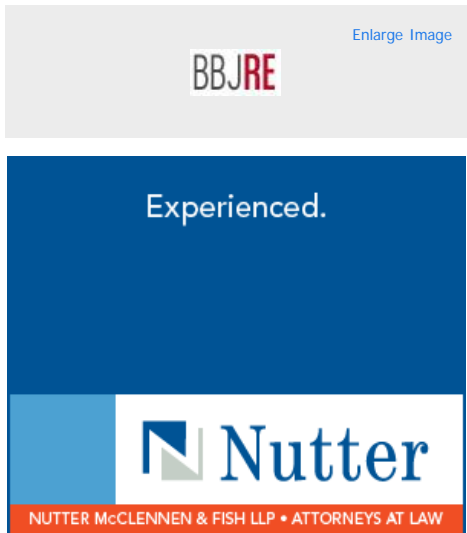

A summary of transactions and personnel moves within Greater Boston's real estate community.

- Margulies Perruzzi Architects has promoted a slate of professionals within its Boston offices. The new appointments include [Monica Moreira](#) , senior associate; [Dianne A. Dunnell](#) , senior associate; [Cynthia Gibson Murphy](#) , associate and [Marnie Glover](#) , associate.
- Ameristar Casinos Inc. has unveiled a plan to buy the 41-acre old Westinghouse site in Springfield for \$16 million to build a proposed luxury hotel and casino that would provide 2,800 jobs, [the Republican reports](#) . The Legislature this week sent a bill that would legalize casino gambling to Gov. [Deval Patrick](#) 's desk, and as the Republican reports, the western part of the state has become ground zero for companies looking to build gaming complexes.
- Quincy officials have given final approvals for a new, \$30 million South Shore YMCA complex, which is on track to open in the spring of 2013, [the Patriot Ledger reports](#) . The new Quincy Y will be nearly a third larger than the current one and will include a new aquatic center, a larger gym, a synthetic-turf field for indoor sports, expanded health and wellness areas and a 220-meter indoor track, the Ledger reports.
- Contractors and landscapers in the Attleboro area say they are being targeted by thieves who are stealing expensive equipment and scrap metal, forcing them to shell out big bucks for better security, the Sun Chronicle reports. Contractors in Attleboro, North Attleboro and Seekonk have been hit in recent weeks. [According to the Sun Chronicle](#) , the victims say they do not know if it is a single ring of thieves or a number of people working independently.
